

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# Our Research Questions

- Do hosts with dark skin tones receive lower anonymous ratings than hosts with lighter skin tones?
  - Yes, hosts with the darkest skintones have significantly lower ratings compared to hosts with lighter skintones. (Previous Study)
- Are these differences reflected in publicly written reviews as well?
  - anonymous ratings vs. public reviews
  - discrete discrimination (behind the cyber curtain)

### Data & Methods

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### Data

- Airbnb listing/host information from 28 cities scraped in January 2020
- Includes:
  - Quantitative ratings (Anonymous) & Qualitative reviews (Public)
  - Listing information (cost, zip code, type of housing, size of space, description, availability, and more)
- Skintone of hosts, which we derive from the hosts' profile pictures on Airbnb (1-5)

### Methods

#### **1** Sentiment Analysis

- Afinn score (-5 to 5)
- get sentiment score for each review
- compare with anonymous rating scores
- 2 Dictionary based topic analysis
  - top negative reviews include: *comfort, communication, cleanliness* (Bridges and Vásquez, 2018)
  - most frequent word clusters: convenience, facility, environment
  - are there differences in the topics that are discussed by skin tones?


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## Sentiment Analysis Example

(Sentiment +21, Rating 99, Skintone 1)

I have a bad experience at night while the other neighbors held parties on their yards and it stops around 4 am!!! It seems cheap place but it is is totally bad experience for my wife and I. (Sentiment -10, Rating 76, Skintone 5)

Results

#### Sentiment Analysis



- Postions relative to the line shows whether a host is getting a higher/lower rating (anonymous) than the sentiment of the reviews (public)
- Skintone 5 (Darkest) have many points that are below the line





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# Summary of Results

- Darker skintone hosts often receive lower rating scores than what the public reviews suggest (compared to lighter skintone hosts)
- For darker skintone hosts, fewer number topics are discussed in the reviews
- For darker skintone hosts, different topics are discussed in the reviews
  - more about cleanliness, less about convenience, environment, or facility
